Complications of vasectomy: results from a prospective audit of 105,393 procedures

Over the 15-year study period, data from 105,393 vasectomies was collected from ASPC members. Early failure rates were available for 69,500 patients, occurring in 648 patients (0.93%). Of 99,124 patients, late failure occurred in 41 (0.04%).

Of 102,549 vasectomies, post-operative infection was reported in 1250 patients (1.22%), haematoma in 1599 patients (1.56%) and PVPS in 139 patients (0.14%).

This large, prospective audit provides accurate, contemporaneous complication rates which can inform future pre-vasectomy counselling.
